Signs of Dehydration in Elderly

Electrolyte imbalances caused by dehydration can impact cardiac status, renal impairment, and mental deterioration. Other symptoms of dehydration include:

- Dizziness
- Confusion
- Constipation
- Fever
- Decreased urine output

- Muscle weakness
- Headaches
- Depression

Causes of Dehydration in Nursing Homes

Dehydration in nursing home residents may be caused by several factors, including:

- Insufficient staff for the number of residents
- Unqualified and/or overworked attendants
- Poor supervision
- Elevated temperatures
- · Medications such as diuretics, laxatives and steroids
- Medical conditions including Alzheimer's and other dementia, depression, stroke, diabetes, urinary incontinence, vomiting, diarrhea, fever and Parkinson's Disease
- A resident's inability to identify when they are thirsty (a natural consequence of aging for some)
- Language barriers

California Nursing Home Negligence Laws

Under the California Health and Safety Code and other regulations, <u>nursing homes have</u> <u>specific responsibilities to residents</u>, known as Duty of Care. These include providing all residents with enough fluid to maintain proper hydration and health. *When a nursing home fails to do this, and this failure causes injury or <u>death</u>, the nursing home may be <u>legally liable</u> for damages. There are also cases where dehydration may have been caused by faulty equipment or an improperly maintained facility, in which case product or premises liability may apply. As part of evaluating your case, our personal injury attorneys can assist in determining who may be liable.*

What Type of Compensation is Available?

If you or your loved one has been injured as a result of dehydration in a nursing home, you may be entitled to compensation. The type and amount depend largely on the *cause* of the injury. *There are maximum penalties for injuries caused by professional negligence on the part of a nursing home*. However, if it is determined that another cause is to blame – such as willful misconduct, <u>abuse</u>, or negligence on the part of an entity that is not a licensed healthcare provider – these limits do not apply. <u>If it can be proven</u> that the conduct of the wrongdoer was fraudulent, malicious or despicable, the sufferer is also entitled to recover punitive damages. The amount of such damages depends on the severity of the misconduct and the defendant's economic status.
